The following describes the ISD procedures for locating, identifying, and evaluating students who need special education programs and services. The COPESD assumes primary responsibility for child find activities and outreach for preschool children. The COPESD Early On Program will be responsible for coordinating Child Find activities and outreach. All local school districts will assume responsibility for in-school and out of school youth up to the age of 26 through the special education programs/services and will establish cooperative liaisons with other agencies and professionals who may be potential referral sources. COPESD staff will coordinate the Project Find Campaign through the use of state Project Find materials. The local district in which county jails are located (Cheboygan, Gaylord, Rogers City) are responsible for conducting child find activities for all eligible ages including students in county jails as well as other low incidence placements, such as residential facilities, homebound, hospitalized, etc.

The following describes the ISD activities, including partnerships with community agencies, and the forms of media used in the ISD outreach efforts:

The procedures for identifying potential school age special education students may include review of existing school records and inter-agency collaboration for referral of student dropouts, Michigan Project Find materials, Early On information, and Special Education Parent Handbook. Information pertaining to special education evaluations, procedures and processes will be distributed to the public as follows:

- 1. News articles informing the public on Special Education opportunities required under law
- 2. A written description of available services and the means of obtaining them
- 3. Brochures describing programs/services
- 4. North Country Community Mental Health
- 5. Department of Health and Human Services
- 6. Health Department of Northwest Michigan and District Health Department 4

Superintendents or their designee will advise and inform persons with disabilities, their parents, and other members of the community, as to the special education opportunities required under the laws and the obligations of local and Educational Service Districts. All public awareness information will be available in the native language of the parents.

Option 1: Modification of a Part 3 Rule

Please Note: Only the portion of the rule being modified is listed, the remainder of the rule will be fully implemented.

Description of the Changes in Program or Service

R 340.1755 Early Childhood related service providers will work in collaboration with an approved early childhood special education teacher. The required 72 clock hours may be spread across 180 days of instruction across an entire calendar year. Membership will be prorated if a student's IEP/IFSP requires less than 72 hours within the instructional calendar/calendar year. Calculation will be based on the number of IFSP/IEP hours divided by 180.

R 340.1754 To receive full pupil membership, early childhood special education programs must operate 450 clock hours. However, programs are not required to operate a minimum number of days or hours to receive prorated pupil membership. The prorated calculation for membership will be based on the number of scheduled and provided program hours divided by 450.

R 340.1749a Caseloads may be determined to allow 23 different students with not more than 10 students in the classroom at any one time, and with no more than 10 Full Time Equivalents (FTEs).

R 340.1749b Caseloads may be determined to allow 23 different students with not more than 15 students in the classroom at any one time, and with no more than 10 Full Time Equivalents (FTEs).

R 340.1749c Each teacher shall serve not more than the average of 12 students per class period per instructional day with not more than 15 students in the classroom at any one time.

R 340.1733 Programs for students with severe cognitive impairments and moderate cognitive impairments may exceed a 6 year age span as determined by the IEPT.

IV. Paraprofessional Qualifications

See **R 340.1832(h)** and **R 340.1793** in the <u>MARSE</u> concerning the paraprofessional qualifications section of the ISD Plan.

The following are the minimal requirements for paraprofessionals.

Qualifications for paraprofessional personnel specifically follow R340.1793 and R340.1793a of the revised administrative rules for special education. In addition, the COPESD and local school districts require paraprofessionals to possess a high school diploma and follow all the state and federal requirements.

Transportation procedures are monitored on a continual basis by the local school district supervisors of transportation.

VI. Millage Fund Distribution

The following is the method of distribution for millage funds in the ISD that meets the requirements of R 340.1811 and R 340.1812.

The Cheboygan-Otsego-Presque Isle Educational Service District distributes special education millage based on Rule 340.1811.

Determination of constituent district special education program and service costs are based solely upon costs as reported and allowed by the department which are in compliance with these rules. Costs of required transportation are included.

Unreimbursed costs shall constitute the operational cost claim against educational service district special education tax funds.

If funds are available for distribution after cost of programs and services provided by the ESD are met, the process to be used will be based on Rule 340.1811.

If funds are sufficient to cover the cost of programs and/or services provide by the educational service district, the bill back procedure agreed upon by the COPESD Board of Education and constituent district boards of education will be followed.

VII. Parent Advisory Committee (PAC)

The following is the ISD's process for appointing PAC members in accordance with R 340.1838(1) and (2).

The COPESD Board of Education will appoint the Parent Advisory Committee whose members may serve as long as their child is eligible for special education services or until the Superintendent of their LEA nominates another member, whichever comes first. The Director of Special Education or designee is responsible for assuring that a recommendation is made to the Board. Recommendations are made by each LEA.

PAC Participation and Additional Responsibilities

The following describes how the PAC participates in the development of the ISD Plan.

Plan Development:

The Cheboygan-Otsego-Presque Isle Educational Service District plan and amendments to such shall be developed in cooperation with the PAC. It shall be the responsibility of the Coordinator for Planning/Monitoring to assure that the PAC members are provided with copies of the current Educational Service District plan, subsequent and proposed amendments and deviation requests.

Upon request, the Coordinator for Planning/Monitoring will review the COPESD plan with the PAC. At subsequent meetings, the PAC will review any changes in the plan and/or areas of concern from the PAC membership.

The Coordinator for Planning/Monitoring will develop a draft of the Educational Service District plan to be presented to the PAC for reactions and suggestions. An attempt will be made to reconcile any differences that may exist. If these differences cannot be reconciled, the Coordinator of Planning/Monitoring will advise the PAC Chairperson of the objection process as defined by rule 340.1836.

Prior to the submission of date, the PAC Chairperson shall be asked to sign the plan endorsement page indicating that the PAC has been involved in the development of the plan. **The following describes how the PAC may file an objection to the ISD plan in accordance with R 340.1836(1).** Any PAC objections to the COPESD plan for the Delivery of Special Education Programs and Services will be subject to a majority vote of the members in attendance at a regularly scheduled monthly meeting.

PAC members may provide advisory input on any matters which the committee deems appropriate to the improvement of special education services within the ESD.

The Director of Special Education shall be responsible for assuring that reasonable secretarial and clerical support is available to the PAC for committee business.

The following resource types are available to assist the PAC.

The Educational Service District will provide a budget to include:

- 1. Mileage reimbursement for PAC meeting attendance.
- 2. Postage for notices and other committee mailings.
- 3. All related phone calls made from the office.
- 4. Reproduction of appropriate documents for committee business.
- 5. Secretarial services.
- 6. In-service related to the function of the PAC.
- 7. Informational materials for the PAC.

Staff Resources: The COPESD shall make available staff resources for the purpose of making the Parent Advisory Committee an informed, efficient, and effective operational unit.

Other Support: The Director of Special Education shall be responsible for assuring that reasonable secretarial and clerical support is available to the PAC for committee business.
